We Still Live Here / As Nutayunean is an extraordinary DVD documentary about a cultural revival among the Wampanoag Tribes of Cape Cod, known in history as the tribe that aided the survival of the Pilgrims, originating the holiday known as Thanksgiving. Linguist Jessie Little Doe Baird, the winner of a MacArthur 'genius' award, has sparked efforts to revitalize and reclaim the Wampanoag language. With the language restoration comes the reinvigoration of culture, traditions, and roots; Jessie's own daughter Mae is the first Native speaker of Wampanoag in a century. We Still Live Here is a powerful and emotionally moving documentary, highly recommended for public, high school, and college library DVD collections. 56 min., SDH captions.
