### BABY, IT'S YOU

Award-winning filmmaker Anne Makepeace (the Emmy nominated "Moonchild") has named this documentary offspring "Baby, It's You," and it's the funny, poignant and maybe sad story of a woman searching for the baby she's never had. In its glorious hybrid form the mix of medical procedure and personal genealogy this baby, from Makepeace Prods., is honest and intellectually captivating.

The show kicks off the 11th season of PBS's P.O.V. series, highlighting independent, nonfiction filmmaking. Writer/director/producer Makepeace turns the camera on herself and her husband, Peter Behrens, as they try like mad to make a baby.

But the maze of contemporary fertility science into which Makepeace and Behrens wander namely a procedure called ART, the transfer of fertilized eggs into a woman's uterus is a mind-boggling and often dead-end street of pain, sacrifice and hope. The fuel is the couple's great desire to have a baby, but whether their stamina can survive the ordeal of fertility procedures is iffy at best.

The docu especially shines when it strays from medicine to ask the big question: What if parenthood is not in the cards? But even if there is no baby at road's end, there is at least its namesake, this stirring documentary.
